

Introduction

This is the 4th *Giving Ireland Report*, building on over a decade of research into nonprofit funding. The journey began in 2010 with the launch of *Fundraising Performance: The First Annual Report on Fundraising in Ireland* by 2into3. That inaugural study analysed the financial accounts of just 80 nonprofit organisations for 2009, with data personally provided by participants. Fourteen years later, Giving Ireland has evolved into a comprehensive analysis of the sector, mapping its funding landscape and reflecting its growth and increasing complexity.

Since those early days, our study has expanded from 80 organisations to over 1600. The establishment of Benefacts in 2015 enabled us to work with a representative sample of nonprofit organisations, allowing for more comprehensive insights into the sector’s funding patterns. However, the closure of Benefacts in 2021 has presented significant challenges. While the Charities Regulator’s [Register](#) now provides financial data on charities, there remains no publicly accessible resource for nonprofits without charitable status.

Access to high quality data is further limited by the ongoing issue of abridgement, highlighting a mismatch between the reporting standards of accountants and the level of detail and transparency needed by the sector. This long-standing challenge may be exacerbated by recent changes to financial reporting thresholds under the Companies Act 2014 (Law Reform Commission, 2024), allowing more organisations to file abridged accounts, reducing visibility into nonprofit finances.

Amid these challenges, there are promising developments. The publication of Ireland’s first *National Philanthropy Policy* in late 2023 marks an important milestone and is the product of years of work by voluntary sector advocates. The policy seeks to strengthen Ireland’s culture of philanthropy while prioritising better data collection and research outputs critical for evidence-based decision-making (DRCD, 2023).

This year’s *Giving Ireland Report* examines the funding of Ireland’s registered nonprofits in 2022, offering estimated income figures and funding models while tracking changes from 2021. In 2022, the sector continued its recovery from the Covid-19 pandemic, with fundraising increasing by 18%, following a drop-off in 2020 and 2021. Government supports introduced during the pandemic tapered off, while new measures to combat persistent inflation were introduced. Though new charity scandals in recent years have placed additional scrutiny on nonprofits (Murphy, 2024), history shows that the sector weathers these events with resilience.¹ Nonprofits consistently demonstrate accountability and rebuild collective trust when necessary, ensuring their mission-driven work continues.

¹ The *Irish Not-for-Profit Sector: Fundraising Performance Report 2017* notes that fundraising saw an increase in 2015, despite several scandals in 2014. This suggests that, for the most part, public trust in the sector remained intact (2into3, 2017).

Despite ongoing hurdles, the future is promising. With the implementation of the National Philanthropy Policy, we anticipate a renewed focus on data quality and research. As the data baseline improves, we plan to expand our analyses, which we have narrowed somewhat in recent years due to poor data availability. Looking ahead to 2025, we expect changes to the Giving Ireland methodology that will enable us to enhance and expand our insights. We encourage readers to reflect on what they would like to see in future reports and share their feedback with us. Finally, we extend our thanks to Ireland's nonprofits for their vital contributions to society and their continued support of this research.

Methodology

This report is based on a stratified random sample of registered Irish nonprofits reporting income for 2022, representing 10% of the 'addressable market' of registered nonprofits in Ireland, as defined by the Irish Directory of Nonprofits. These organisations span 12 subsectors, classified using the Johns Hopkins International Nonprofit Classification adapted to the Irish context (Donoghue, 1998). Subsector representation in the sample was proportional to its size in the overall sector, and systematic random sampling was used within each subsector, selecting every n^{th} organisation by ascending income. Financial data were drawn from the Charities Regulator's Register of Charities and supplemented by VisionNet. To estimate the sector from the sample, results were extrapolated using multipliers selected for each subsector based on their proportional weight. Findings in the report refer to these extrapolated results unless specified otherwise, in which case the analysis pertains to the sample size indicated.

During analysis, 383 organisations were excluded due to incomplete accounts or missing 2021 financial data, reducing the sample from 2,054 to 1,671. As these organisations could not be replaced due to limited data availability, the final sample reflects a smaller proportion of the sector than originally intended. To address these changes, multipliers were recalculated based on the revised proportional weights of each subsector within the sample. A correction factor was then applied post-extrapolation to align results more closely with the original population proportions.

As in previous years, the top 2% of outliers for each income category were excluded during extrapolation to prevent distortion and then reintroduced afterward to maintain overall balance. A more detailed methodology, including a full explanation of adjustments and exclusions, is available on the [Giving Ireland website](#).

Limitations and Future Directions

As with all Giving Ireland reports, the findings offered in this report are estimates and should be interpreted as indicative rather than definitive. This year's findings are not directly

comparable with previous reports due to differences in sampling and data availability. The exclusion of 383 organisations and the subsequent recalibration of results introduced additional complexity. Furthermore, sampling poses inherent limitations, including a margin of error. The abridgement of accounts and the presentation of income data in aggregate made precise analysis more challenging, as many organisations lack detailed income breakdowns. There is also an inevitable lag in data publication; this report reflects 2022 financial data, while the report itself was published in 2024. Finally, where financial accounts were not directly available, figures published by the Charities Regulator’s [Register](#) were used. This data is self-reported by charitable organisations and may contain inaccuracies. Acknowledging this limitation, cross-checks were conducted wherever possible to verify the data, although reliance on self-reported figures may still allow for discrepancies.

Despite these challenges, the adjustments made ensure a representative analysis of the sector. In future reports, Giving Ireland is exploring ways to address these limitations and enhance the precision of our analyses. As data quality and reporting improve in Ireland, we aim to refine our methodology and analysis further. Additional details, including the full sample breakdown and an index of organisations, are available in the Appendix.

Findings


Funding of the Nonprofit Sector

In 2022, the nonprofit sector in Ireland was primarily funded by the State, with 56% of the sector’s turnover attributed to public sources. While this finding reflects the State’s traditionally significant role in supporting the sector, it represents a slightly smaller share compared to previous reports, accounted for by a greater proportional *Earned* income.

Earned revenue accounted for nearly one-third of the sector’s funding in 2022, highlighting an increasing reliance on independent revenue generation.


Figure 2: Subsectoral funding models, 2022

However, this aggregated funding model does not show the notable variations between subsectors. This is explored further in Figure 2. Importantly, 5% of the sector’s funding is attributed as *Other* income. This category includes investment, sponsorship, which is neither fully earned nor fundraised, income reported as miscellaneous, income reported in aggregate, and which cannot be disaggregated (e.g., fundraised and government grants

Figure 1: Sector funding model, 2022




together) and income simply not categorised. These dimensions of *Other* income are examined in depth later in this report.

Figure 2 illustrates the subsectoral variations in funding models, underscoring the diversity of income sources within the nonprofit landscape.² For instance, Health, Social Services and Local Development & Housing have traditionally relied heavily on public funding, often through service-level agreements that enable these organizations to act on behalf of the State in delivering essential services. Meanwhile, subsectors like Philanthropy & Voluntarism, International and Religion rely primarily on fundraising. Still, other sectors, like Professional & Vocational rely more on earned revenue. In 2022, the Environment subsector reported an earned revenue leading model, while in other reports, Environment has relied more on fundraised income. This change, despite the treatment of outliers, can be attributed to two very large, animal-focused organisations with earned revenue models. There is certainly fundraised income present in this figure. This variation is also indicative of the organisational variety even within subsectors. Environment, while a relatively small body of organisations, consists of some environmental and sustainability organisations but more often, water cooperatives and animal welfare organisations.


Some subsector funding models feature a disaggregated *Other* income category, where sponsorship or investment was substantial enough. We note that this year, some subsectors reported a significant amount of aggregate or uncategorised income. Roughly one third of all reported income by religious organisations fell under *Other*, in line with Religion’s historically poor reporting habits but also reflecting the large number of newer, small congregations in that sector (Carruthers, 2023; Robbins & Lapsley, 2015). Local Development & Housing (18%) and Environment (16%) also reported a high proportion of “Other” income, indicative of the large share of relatively small non-charities in each sector who, under the Companies Act 2014, may file less detailed statements (CRO, n.d.).

² The Sports & Recreation, Environment and Philanthropy & Voluntarism subsectors received additional, isolated treatment of outliers to address additional skewing of their funding models.













The nonprofit sector reported an estimated €20.3 billion in 2022, up 11% from 2021. This is indicative of the sector’s continued recovery following the Covid-19 pandemic and a return to pre-pandemic growth trends. Figure 3 shows that within the sample, 43% of organisations experienced income growth, driving this increase. The majority of organisations experiencing “no change” had an income of €0 in both years.

One third of our sample, reflective of the sector, reported an income of €0. This is seen in Figure 4, which places organisations in the sample into total income brackets. The sector has been historically comprised of mostly small organisations, with 68% of organisations in our sample recording an income of under €250,000.

Figure 5 highlights the different realities faced by organisations of different sizes. Smaller organisations, more susceptible to both internal and external shocks (Young, 2023), experienced income loss, while the largest organisations in the sector saw the most growth. Larger organisations, with greater strategic capacity and diverse funding models, are often better prepared to weather such shocks. The sector’s turnover, unevenly distributed across organisation sizes, also varies by subsector. Moreover, the size of a given sector did not always translate to proportional income. Figure 6 highlights discrepancies between size and income, particularly for Local Development & Housing, a sector comprised of many, small cooperatives and community initiatives. Conversely, other sectors, especially Health, regularly bring in far more income proportional to their size. Health, as well as the Advocacy, Law & Politics, Philanthropy & Voluntarism and International subsectors include some of Ireland’s largest organisations and figuratively punch above their weight.

Figure 6: Size of sector vs. representative turnover





Figure 7 maps subsectoral changes in total income between 2021 and 2022. The greatest change is seen in Philanthropy & Voluntarism, where income increased by 24% from 2021. Arts also experienced a substantial (19%) increase in income. Total turnover can be seen to increase, if only slightly, across the board, excepting Religion, where income fell 4%.

Figure 7: Changes in total income by subsector 2021-2022




Public income

Public funding of the nonprofit sector consists of both grants and contracts or commissions from Irish bodies and agencies, as well as EU funds and income from other governments. The Charities Register breaks public funding down further into income from “Government or Local Authorities” and “Other Public Bodies”. There was insufficient data from non-Charities to allow for this breakdown in the analysis, though future reports will seek to explore public funding trends in greater depth.

The Irish Government has traditionally been the primary funding source for the nonprofit sector. This trend has continued, with public funding accounting for 56% of the sector’s total turnover and an estimated €10.8 billion, up 7% year-on-year. Though Covid-19 supports tapered off between 2021 and 2022, new supports for inflation became available. We observe an ongoing symbiosis between the Government and the Third Sector, characterised by the evolution of the nature of State funding, toward a

commission model as the sector continues to grow and professionalise (Boyle & Shannon, 2018). While this working relationship between State and sector funds vital work, it comes with unique challenges and debate over their respective roles and responsibilities. The administrative burden of compliance for recipients of grant funding or undertaking Service Level Agreements is significant, despite ongoing efforts and advocacy for streamlined reporting (The Wheel, 2024). As the State continues to fund the nonprofit sector, organisations still often require unrestricted funding, which they seek through other means, such as earning revenue and fundraising.

State support is unevenly distributed across the sector, with a significant concentration in certain subsectors and among a small number of large organisations. As illustrated in Figure


8, the top 3% of nonprofits in our sample received 87% of reported public funding. However, it’s important to note that some state funding may be underreported, particularly by smaller organisations, which often do not fully disclose their income. This concentration of funding is also driven by the nature of the relationship between these organisations and the State, such as Section 38 organisations, which play a key role in delivering health, housing, and social services on behalf of the State. Public funding of the nonprofit sector varies by subsector.


Figure 10: Changes in public funding by subsector, 2021-2022

As seen in Figure 9, Social Services received one quarter of reported public funding, followed closely by Health (23%) and Education & Research (21%). With the provision of homeless supports and other key human services by Social Services, the activities of large, publicly funded hospitals with nonprofit status, and the funding of third-level education by the HEA and Department of Education, the State plays a central role in the funding and operation of these organisations. Public funding grew modestly year-on-year, as seen in Figure 10, though there are notable differences in funding across subsectors. For example, Environment organisations receive a relatively small share of state funding compared to sectors like Education and Health, which have seen increased support. It is also worth noting that where state funding may appear relatively low for a subsector, it may still represent a significant portion of that subsector’s total funding. For example, public funding comprises a third of total funding for international organisations, despite accounting for just 2% of overall State funding. These variations reflect the different funding structures and priorities that shape the allocation of public resources to various nonprofit activities.

Earned income

In recent years, earned revenue has grown in both scale and importance to the sector, especially as organisations seek unrestricted income. Earned income consists of mission-related business activities which generate revenue. In this way, nonprofits, while ‘non-market’ organisations, become increasingly ‘business-like’, engaging in an economic exchange of goods or services, though the proceeds are reinvested into the organisation. Event tickets, fees for training or facilities, sale of merchandise and rental income are included in this category.

Earned revenue accounted for an estimated €5.5 billion in 2022, up 22% from 2021. Earned revenue, which was stunted by the pandemic, is seen to clearly recover.

Figure 12: Changes in earned income by subsector, 2021-2022





Figure 12 reveals that much of this growth can be attributed to Education & Research and Health. We believe that earned income for Sport and Local Development & Housing are higher, though this is obscured by the presence of uncategorised data.

Fundraised income


Figure 13: Distribution of sample across fundraising brackets, 2022

2022 marked a year of growth and recovery for fundraising in Ireland. Fundraised income was €1.83 billion, up 17.5% from 2021. Figure 13 shows that over half of organisations do not report fundraised income at all, while one quarter of fundraising organisations raise between €1 and €49,000. This is particularly striking when compared to Figure 14, where fundraised income is distributed by organisational size. With 80% of fundraising reported by 3% of organisations, a hyper-concentration is observable. Figure 14 further demonstrates this effect, where the majority of organisations do not report fundraised income at all, while organisations over €10 million account for less than 1% of the population³.

As with total income, the sector experiences a diminishing returns effect, wherein larger organisations fundraising at a high level are less impacted by actual growth and smaller fundraising organisations are more prone to shocks (see Figure 15). We also point to the significant capacity required to operate a fundraising department and note that many

fundraising organisations in Ireland do so without fulltime fundraising staff or by relying on volunteers.

Figure 15 illustrates the extent to which the fundraising gains of the largest fundraising organisations drives sectoral growth. Moreover, while the sector’s story for 2022 is one of recovery, this may not be the case for smaller organisations.

Looking at subsectoral distribution, Philanthropy & voluntarism received the greatest share of fundraised income in 2022 at 19%, followed by International at 16% and Religion at 15%. This is indicative of a developing philanthropic landscape, which includes philanthropic foundations of all shapes and sizes. Our sample features a range of philanthropic organisations including hospital and university foundations. Philanthropic organisations in Ireland belong to a small but active cohort of grantmaking foundations and fundraising organisations. Religion continues to receive a large share of fundraised income. Faith-based giving traditionally forms a key part of Ireland’s giving identity, with tithing and mass collections having long been a fixture in daily life. However, as participation in traditional religion in Ireland (e.g., Catholicism), declines, the Catholic Church can be observed to make large “philanthropic” transfers between orders and gift properties. Other organisations, despite their primary aim being the advancement of religion, have secondary charitable aims ranging from the advancement of education to the prevention or relief of poverty or economic hardship, which are popular causes for donation.

Figure 16: Subsectoral distribution of fundraised income, 2022




Figure 17 shows subsectoral variations year-on-year, though fundraising can be seen to increase across the board. The largest percentage growth in fundraising can be observed for International (37%), Philanthropy & Voluntarism (34%) and Health (21%).

Figure 17: Changes in fundraised income by subsector, 2021-2022




Figure 18: Average change in fundraised income by subsector, 2021-2022

Figure 18 shows average changes in fundraised income by subsector. Notably, while fundraising can be seen to increase across the board, Environment and Religion experienced negative average growth, suggesting that fewer, larger organisations compensated. The most average growth was accounted for by the International, Philanthropy & Voluntarism and Health subsectors. We note that these subsectors were the most likely to feature very large, fundraising organisations.

Fundraising mix

This report does not offer data on fundraising by method, as annual reports do not consistently contain that level of detail and tend to lack nuance. In previous years, we have included an illustrative excerpt from the Irish Giving Index, which tracks the self-reported fundraised income for a small sample of Irish nonprofits of varying sizes and from various subsectors. We do not include this breakdown this year but plan to collect additional data in the future to address this gap.

In previous reports and anecdotally, fundraising can be seen to increasingly rely on relationship-based methods over traditional, transaction fundraising. While the investment in such methods is higher, returns also tend to be higher and more sustained, as donors return to give again. This move toward relational fundraising is indicative of the broader professionalisation of the sector and continuing development of the fundraising profession (Mitchell, 2023).


Other income

Figure 19 breaks down the “other income” category and shows the proportion each subcategory accounted for as part of total income, while Figure 20 shows the proportional breakdown of the “Other” category. Other income accounted for €1.03 billion in 2022, up 56% from 2021. We add a caveat, that the quality of corresponding 2021 data is often lower, therefore this figure may be slightly inflated. Regardless, a significant amount of income is not categorised. This poses a concerning gap to our ability to accurately measure nonprofit funding in Ireland. However, we include organisations that do not adequately break down their income in this category for illustrative purposes. There is an opportunity for organisations to improve knowledge and data by reporting their income in detail and filing full accounts. Beyond uncategorised income, placing Sponsorship is challenging. Neither strictly fundraised nor earned, it is often presented in aggregate with fundraising and thus, we believe, higher than the €43.9 million reported. Sponsorship income is concentrated in the Sports & Recreation and Arts, Culture & Media sectors and warrants its own study in more detail, particularly as we seek to advance corporate philanthropy in Ireland. Good sponsorship relationships, like donor relationships, may contribute financial and nonfinancial benefits to the organisation and create opportunities for growth.

Giving per capita

Based on Ireland’s population in 2022 and the total reported income from fundraising, we estimate “giving” per capita to be €354, up 14% from the previous year (€310). This estimate reflects the total fundraising income reported by nonprofits, encompassing contributions from individual donors, Corporate Philanthropy, and Trust & Foundation Philanthropy. Due to our inability to disaggregate these figures, the estimate is likely higher than might be expected if it focused solely on individual giving.

The Irish Household Budget Survey provides some insight into self-reported charitable giving but is limited by its two-week reporting window and a single question on giving, which excludes data on gift destinations, average gift size, and popular causes (CSO, 2016). Additionally, while the CAF 2020 Ireland report identifies top causes for donations from a sample of 1,000 respondents, it has not been replicated.

This estimate highlights the breadth of fundraising activities in Ireland and underscores the need for donor-focused studies to provide more precise insights into individual giving patterns and preferences.

Figure 21: Per capita fundraising by subsector, 2021-2022




Figure 21 shows concentrated giving per capita around Philanthropy & Voluntarism, International and Religion, despite the latter experiencing a decrease in per capita giving year on year. Again, this figure includes philanthropic grants and transfers which inflates our findings.

The table above highlights variations in charitable giving across countries, both in total amounts and as a share of GDP. Ireland's total giving in 2022 reached approximately €1.8 billion, translating to a per capita figure of €354. This is significantly higher than the per capita giving in the UK (€220) and the Netherlands (€299) but falls short of the United States, which leads with €1,423 per capita.

However, it is worth noting that a portion of Ireland's total giving may encompass categories beyond personal philanthropy, such as corporate donations or state-influenced charitable contributions. When isolating personal giving, Ireland's per capita giving likely aligns more closely with the UK and Netherlands.

In terms of year-over-year changes, giving in the UK saw an increase of £2 billion, according to CAF (2023), reflecting a notable growth in philanthropic activity despite economic challenges. Conversely, the Netherlands experienced a slight decline, with total giving dropping by €0.3 million. Despite limitations to our data, we believe Ireland is beginning to close the longstanding gap in giving between Ireland and the UK.

Conclusion

This year's *Giving Ireland Report* highlights the resilience and adaptability of Ireland's nonprofit sector in navigating ongoing challenges. Sector turnover grew by 12%, reflecting both steady State funding and a renewed growth in fundraising and earned income after two years of decline during COVID-19. Earned income, in particular, now accounts for a larger proportion of the sector's funding model, underscoring the growing importance of unrestricted, independent funding to support organisations in delivering on their missions. As nonprofits seek to diversify their funding, the growth of earned income highlights their innovation and adaptability in meeting evolving needs.

Challenges remain, particularly in the availability and accessibility of comprehensive data, which resulted in some analyses being excluded this year. To address these limitations, Giving Ireland is committed to finding innovative ways to map and understand the sector, providing more detailed and actionable insights. The implementation of Ireland's National Philanthropy Policy presents a promising opportunity for enhanced data collection and a stronger culture of giving.

As the nonprofit sector continues to grow in scope and sophistication, building a reliable data baseline will be essential. Giving Ireland will refine its approach to overcome current challenges while actively seeking new opportunities to capture and analyse the sector's evolving dynamics. We welcome feedback and collaboration to ensure our work continues to reflect the changing landscape of Irish nonprofits.
